THEOLOGICAL LECTURE SERIES LENTEN SPIRITUALITY:



THE ROAD BACK TO GOD

The 40 days of Lent coincides with Jesus' temptation in the wilderness, where he fasted for 40 days and nights, and was tempted by the devil. The season of Lent signifies a time to repent, reflect on our behaviour, our heart posture towards God, and to turn back to Him.

Rev Dr Simon Chan led us through the examination of Psalm 51, King David's plea to God for mercy, forgiveness, and cleansing (from committing adultery with Bathsheba and plotting the murder of his servant, Uriah the Hittite), and pointed out three steps on taking the road back to God: Confession of sins, Restoration of fellowship, and Manifesting the fruits of repentance.

Step 1: Confess our sins (vv 1-6)

Confession is based on the mercy of God

We need to understand that our confession to God should not be driven out of fear of His judgement, but out of the recognition of His unfailing love. God is a loving God, but He is also just, and He will not indulge our sins - because He is just, we must confess, and because He is merciful, we *can* confess. Confession also has to be done with complete honesty before God (v3), and ultimately, we are sinning against God when we sin against people.



Step 2: Restoration of fellowship (vv 7-12)

Cleansing, Fellowship, Joy

God desires to come to us as we turn to Him. He fills us afresh with the Holy Spirit and meets us in our honest confession. The restoration of fellowship with God leads us to experience the sweet joy of His presence through the Holy Spirit, and experience anew the joy of our salvation. Restoration consists of three steps: Cleansing, Fellowship and Joy.

Cleansing: v7,10

Cleansing involves dealing with sin, to remove them with the blood of Christ, and to pray for God to renew our spirit so that we are empowered against falling into sin again.

Fellowship: v9, 11

Fellowship refers to meeting with God and having His presence with us. Our relationship with God should not just be for a functional purpose.

Joy: v8, 12

God takes delight in us when we repent, and in response, we experience again the joy of our salvation.

Step 3: Manifesting the fruits of repentance (vv 13-19)

Personal Resolve and Social Stability

Personal Resolve

Real repentance will always show in the new resolve to live differently - personal resolve involves the transformation of the heart and the translation into outward actions.







Social Stability

In Psalm 51, King David recognised that his sinful actions would affect the nation. As children of God, we have the responsibility to the larger community. We are supposed to be salt and light, not to just live and die to ourselves.

Rev Dr Simon Chan reiterated that it is not just during lent that we should turn back to God. Honestly self-examination should be a daily practice. At the end of each day, we need to ask the Holy Spirit to bring to mind any sins we need to deal with, and move towards repentance.
